SUTA dumping occurs when employers disguise their true unemployment experience to falsely qualify for lower unemployment compensation tax rates. Ethical employers must make up the difference.

"Governor Granholm clearly recognizes the importance of ending SUTA dumping for Michigan's overall business climate," said Carl Camden, President and Chief Operating Officer of Kelly Services. Camden encouraged the legislature to act promptly and effectively on the issue. "We must be sure to fully close this loophole that hurts employees and ethical employers alike," Camden continued. "Leaving open any possibility for this kind of behavior will only encourage future evasions."

Kelly Services was a leader in the campaign to gain Congressional action on the issue in August of 2004. Michigan must enact conforming legislation to comply with the new Federal law.
